The castle La Puebla de Arganzón

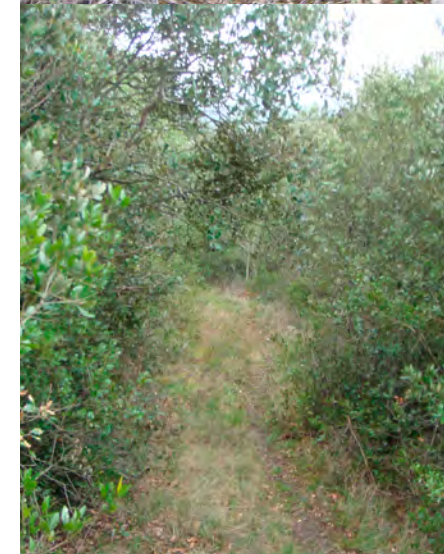
HOTEL ★★★

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Total length: 7 kilometres

Type of walk: circular

Difficulty: low

Path type: small mountain

Our start and arrival point is the main square in La Puebla de Arganzón. We go out from the square towards the right in the main street, walking past the church on our right. Walking on this street we can see at the far end the castle (located on a small hill top), towards where we are walking. We continue straight on this street, leaving the village behind.

The street will turn a bit to the left for crossing the railway and arriving to the old N1 road. We continue until we reach a roundabout where we continue on straight, as we will continue to walk in parallel to the river. We will walk through a tunnel on the right hand side after walking for 10-20 minutes after the roundabout. After the tunnel we will immediately turn left on the path that leads up the hill.

There are more than one path to go up. Our suggestion is to follow the main path until you find a group of stones in the left side of the path. We just need to follow the path till the top, which will lead you to the castle. We can enjoy very nice views from the castle.

If we are already tired we can start walking back to the hotel. In order to change path on the way back we suggest you to continue straight leaving the castle in our back. You can see a path that you can follow all the way back. To come back to the main square in La Puebla de Arganzón we will follow the same path we took in the way in.

If we want to walk a bit longer we can come back towards the back of the castle and look for a path that leads away from the castle and more towards the top of the hill instead of leading downwards. Following this path we will reach the old castle, from which only some stones remain.

To come back we would come back to the main side of the castle and we would take the path that starts in front of it till the bottom of the hill.
